
Mute posts by source

I'm looking to update my camera gear. My main requirement is to have a DSLR that records location data to the EXIF data at the time a photo is taken. I've tried carrying around a GPS logger and then adding location data to the photos after importing to my computer, but I absolutely want to remove that step. When I import my photos (using any application), they should already have the location stored in the EXIF data.

So, what are my options?

- 1. GPS accessory for my existing camera: a Canon Rebel XT. Is this possible? I don't know what kind of accessories it supports.
- 2. Buy a new Canon camera that either has integrated GPS or supports an accessory that accomplishes what I described above. Does this solution exist? I'd prefer Canon if possible only because I already have a couple of Canon lenses, and they seem generally more affordable. Other than that, I have no ties to Canon and would not mind switching to Nikon.
- 3. Buy a Nikon camera and a GP-1 GPS unit.

Reid Yokoyama - Well, I've done option 3 and I am very happy with my Nikon DSLR. I never had Canon equipment, so I can certainly understand the appeal of getting a camera where you can continue to use your current lenses.

Instead of the Nikon GPS unit, I ended up going with the Promote GPS-N-90, which was \$149 (so around \$50 cheaper). Getting a signal indoors is nearly impossible, but I don't think you should expect to get that in a scenario like that

Questions for you fine Buzzy folks:


Do you ever complete your search before you even finish typing your query?

So there you go, it's in Brooklyn. I later found out that this was noted on the Flickr page, but it was hard to find. :)

My position about work accounts was the opposite, but for personal Gmail Buzz, I have decided to connect Twitter, YouTube, Reader, and Picasa to my profile. If you as a follower find this to be annoying, please give me feedback.

My suggestion is that if you follow me on a place like Twitter, you unfollow me there and just follow on Buzz instead.

Michael Wyszomierski - And already I'm having an internal argument with myself about whether or not this makes sense for Google Reader. Just tell me what to do. Feb 9, 2010

Michael Wyszomierski - Hmm, yeah, it makes sense for Reader. More people will know how to follow me on Buzz than on Reader. And those who are savvy enough to use Reader will know how to unfollow me on one service or the other. :)

Reader tip: You can rename feeds if they don't have good titles. Feed settings -> Rename subscription... Feb 12, 2010

John Mueller - I think the followers in Reader is tied to the followers in Buzz, so you'd also miss out on shared items from Reader by unfollowing someone in Buzz. Perhaps Buzz/Reader could just deduplicate and only show each item once even when it's shared in two places? Feb 12, 2010

Adam Lasnik - Wysz, you've hit upon a related issue that's very important to me: the separation / separate priorities of "interesting to know" vs. "personal (about my friends)." This is one of the key reasons why I still read my Facebook newsfeed ("best friends" section) as often as daily, whereas I've read about 0.00001% of twitter updates... because I'm much more concerned about how my friends are feeling or major new milestones in their life vs. "ZOMG, check out this hilarious hamster video! [that I've already been alerted to 42 times]".

Michael Wyszomierski - John, you're right, the followers do sync between Reader and Buzz. Now i need to do some more thinking about my approach. :(

Adam, agreed on all points. Feb 12, 2010

Pedro Dias - So I guess we'll have to wait, mist likely Buzz folks agree on these points also :) Feb 12, 2010

Matt MacMahon - Yeah this is definitely an annoyance with Buzz 1.0. When you Buzz someone you weren't following before, you also auto follow their Reader account if you use Reader. If they feed Reader Shared into Buzz, you now get them in both places. Worse, on Follow, you get a backfill of old items in both places. Hopefully Buzz & Reader work this out soon. Feb 12, 2010
